

## **MUGLER, FREDERICK DAVID WILSON**

Frederick David Wilson Mugler, more affectionately known as Fred Frelantz died Friday in a local hospital. One of Roanoke's most popular radio and television personalities, active in many areas of public service—he hosted the Easter Seals Telethon several years in a row, was a member of the band, "The Vikings", later known as "Roanoke". One of the Valley's most prolific advertising producers: he won the Roanoke Advertising Federation's highest award, the Silver Medal Award, in 1983, and won many national, regional, and local awards for his production of radio and TV commercials. Attended the University of Oklahoma—was a member of Phi Kappa Psi Fraternity. Surviving are his daughter, Whitney Leigh Mugler, Galax, Va., a brother, H. Christopher Mugler, St. Louis, Mo. A memorial service will be from Oakey's Roanoke Chapel 1:30 p.m. Wednesday with Dr. Harry Y. Gamble officiating. Interment will be private.
